working together, they helped a friend.



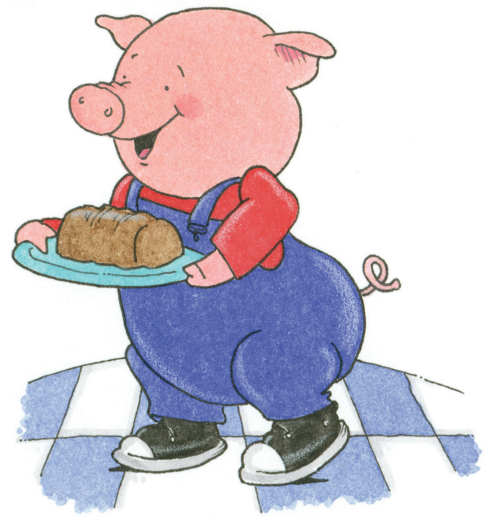

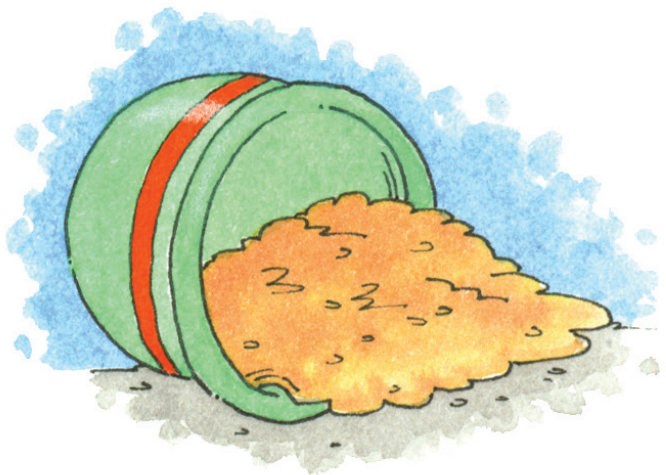


# Little Miss Muffet

Little Miss Muffet sat on a tuffet

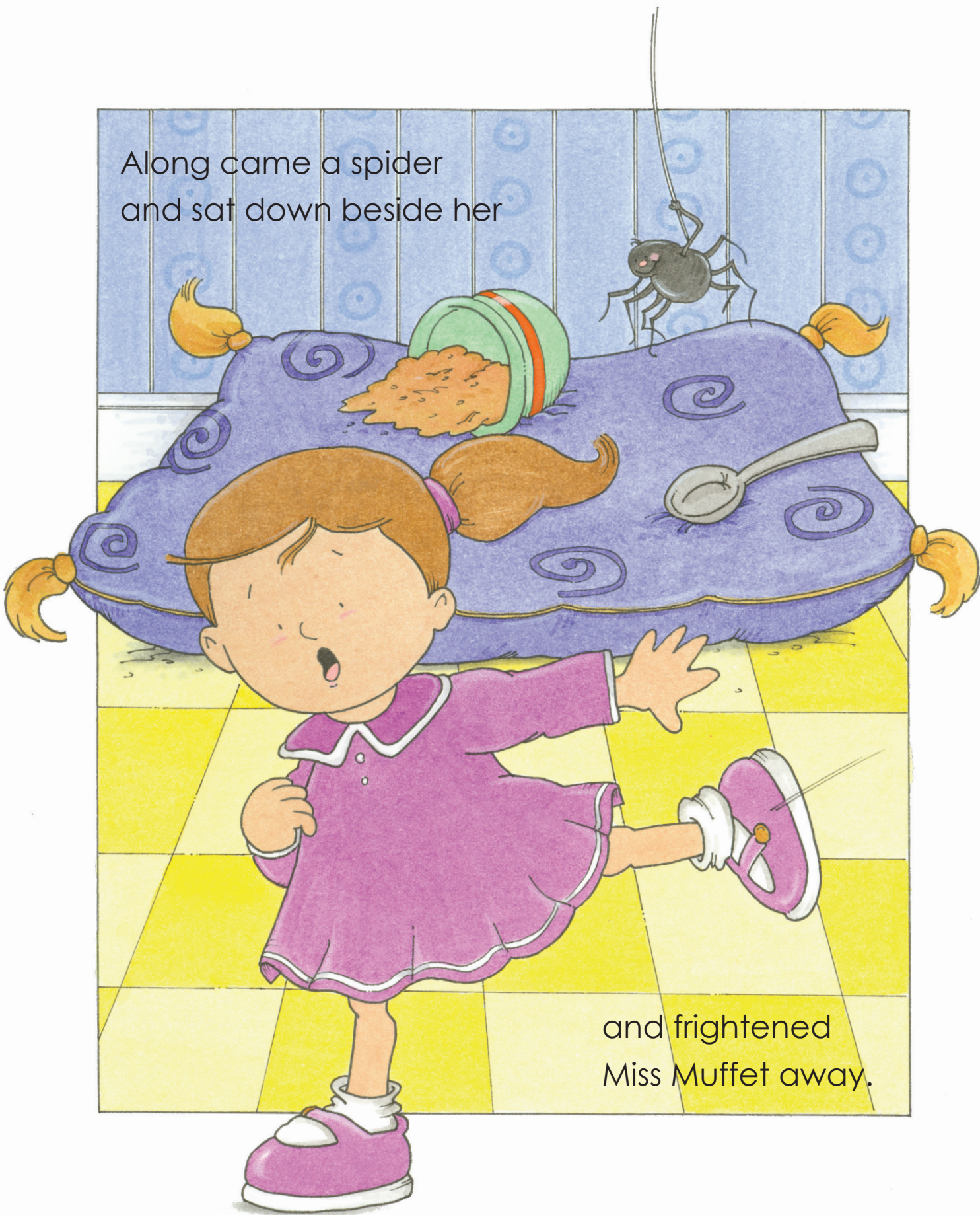


eating her curds and whey.

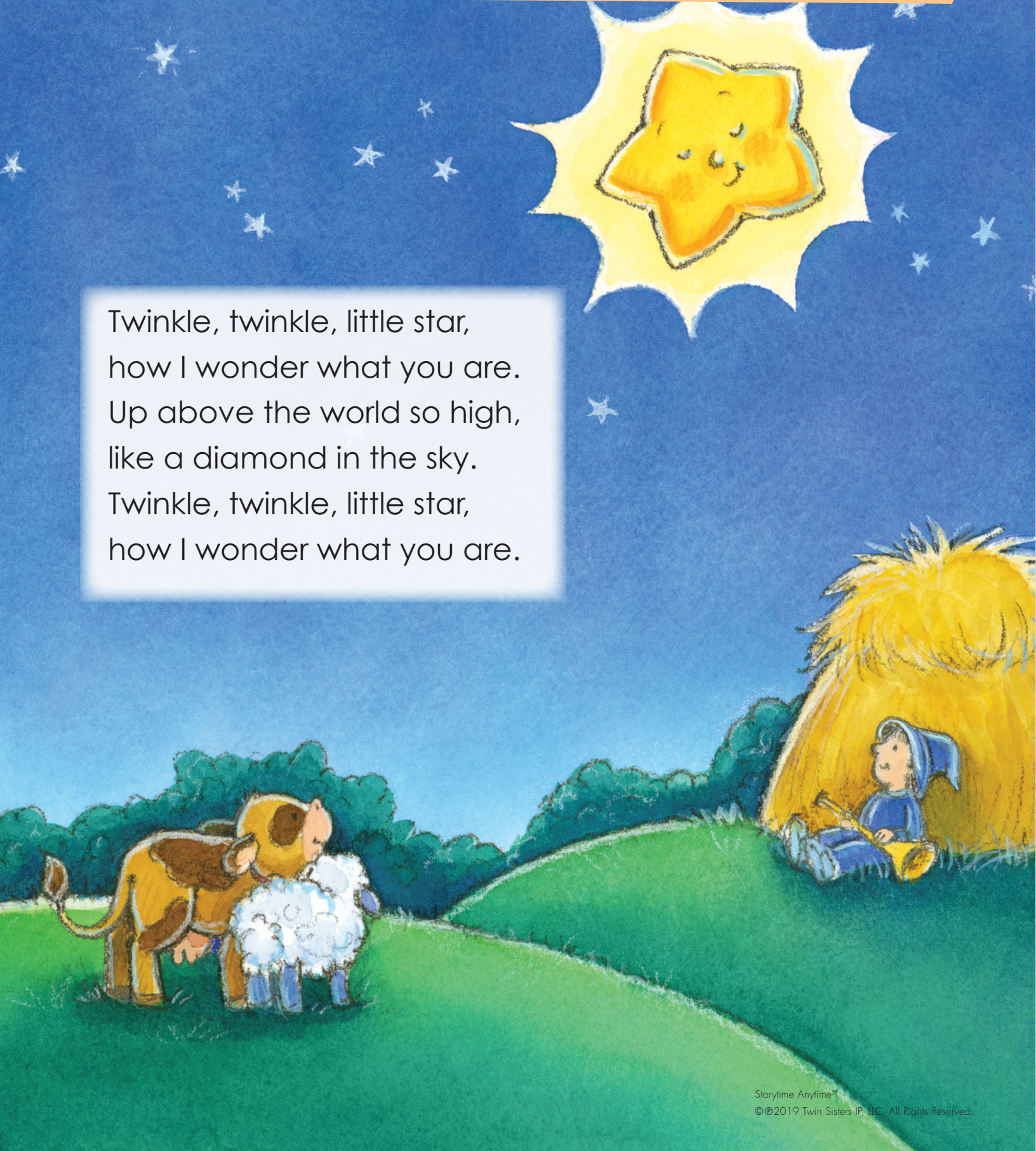

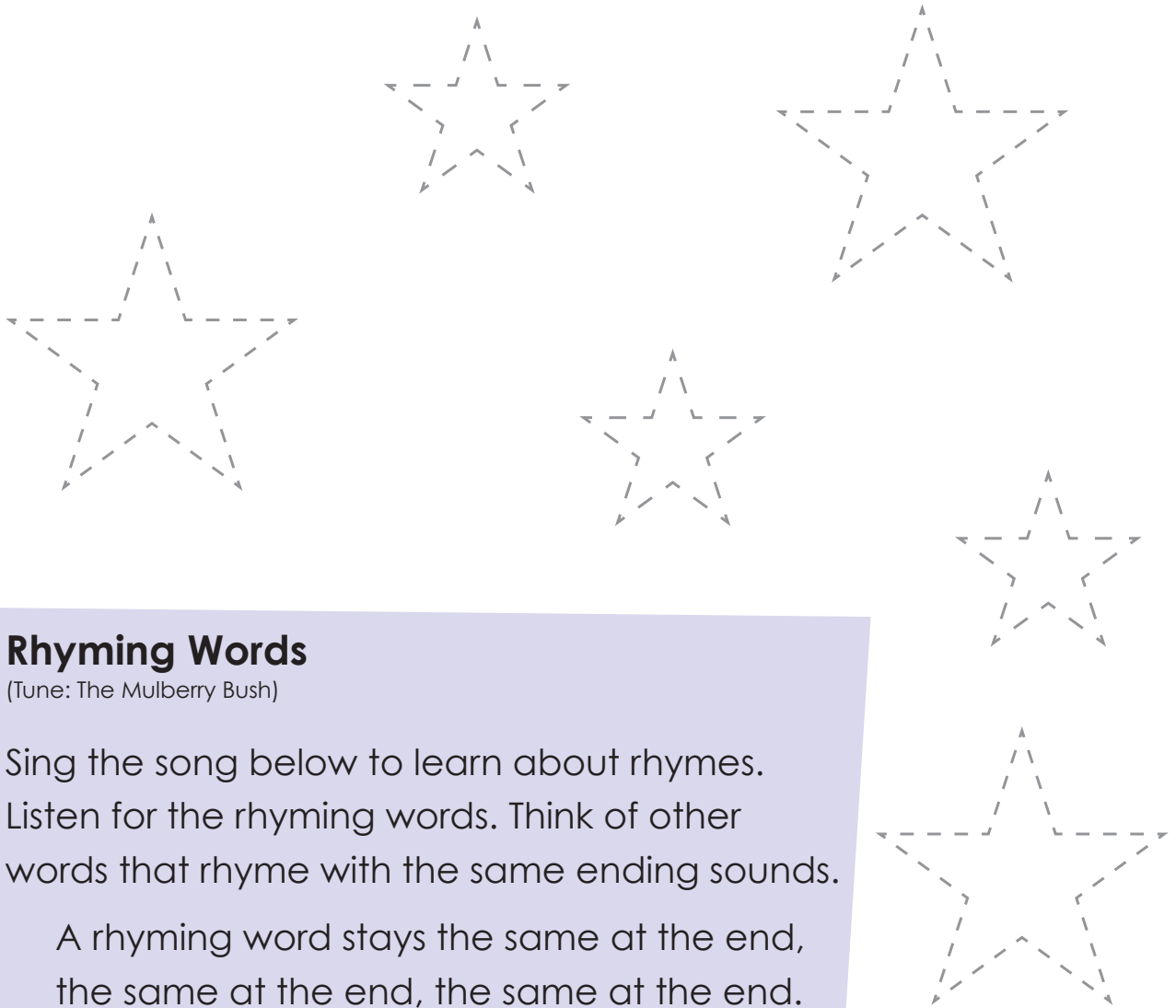
# Twinkle, Twinkle, Little Star

# Little Jack Horner

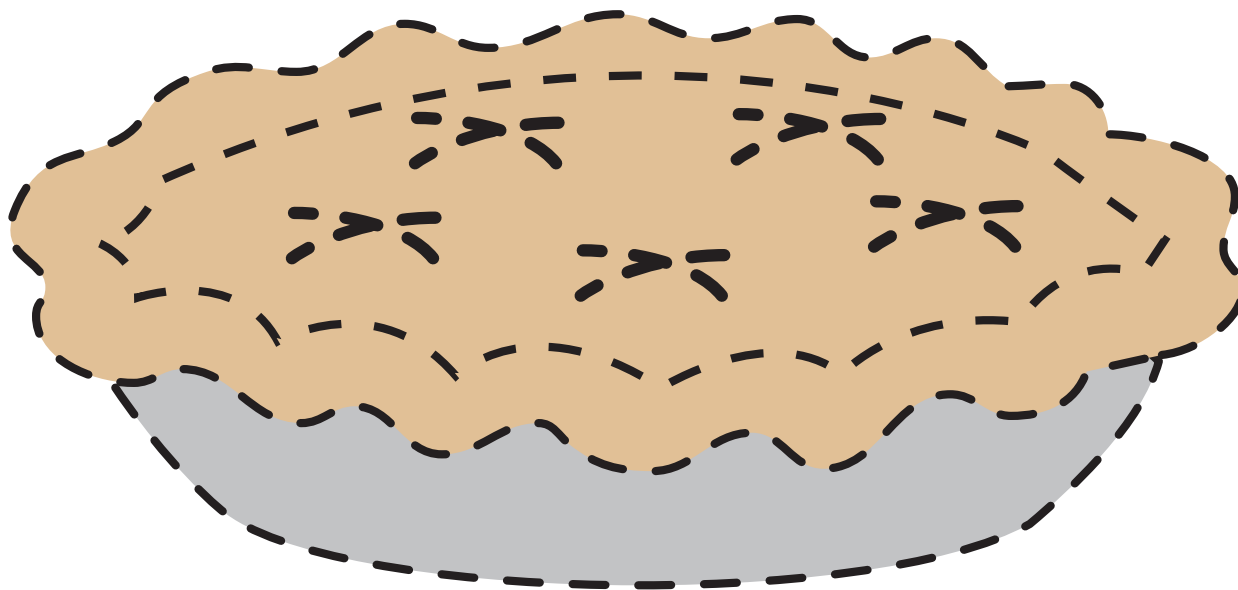

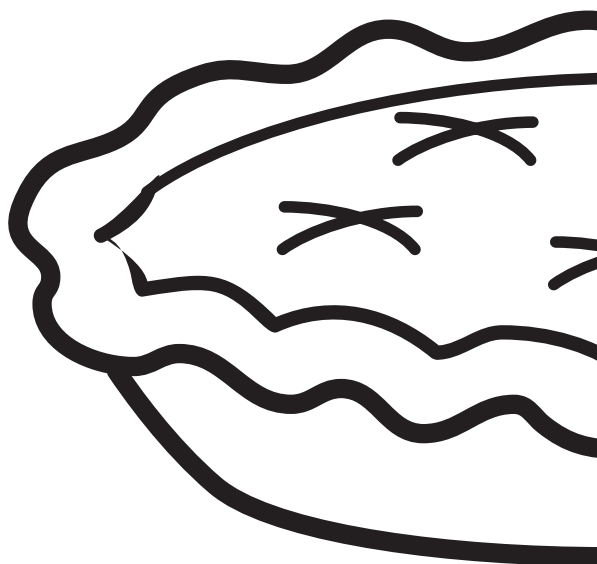
